

**2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Northeast Harbor 5-miler**

Flushed with the satisfaction of achievement, over 100 runners sprinted to the finish line Saturday in Northeast Harbor. They had just run five miles through that village's residential streets and along its scenic shore roads, competing in the Second Annual Northeast Harbor Road Race. One Hundred and forty-one registered to run for fun and for the benefit of Northeast harbor Ambulance Fund. After Paying operating expenses, organizers of the race turned in \$385 to that local volunteer ambulance corps. Breaking the ribbon at the finish line was Ellsworth's Sheldon Booze, a physical education major and a Senior at Springfield College in Massachusetts. Eight Seconds behind him was Bar Harbor's Jon Howland. Jon finished first last year after taking 38 seconds longer to run a different five-mile course. Running over a minute and one-half faster this year was Seal harbor's Dirck Bradt who again took third place.
